# Constitution and Bylaws of the West Virginia State Medical Association 

Enacted April 2, 2022

## Article I: Name

1. The name of this association shall be the West Virginia State Medical Association (hereinafter "WVSMA").

## Article II: Purpose

1. The purpose of the WVSMA shall be to federate and bring together the allopathic and osteopathic physicians and surgeons as defined and governed by the West Virginia Code (Chapter 30 articles 3 and 14, respectively, or their replacements) in the state of West Virginia. In so doing, the WVSMA will advocate for the professional interests of the membership by:
a. Promoting the art, science, and practice of medicine for the betterment of public health and the health and welfare of the profession.
b. Supporting medical education, research, and the dissemination of knowledge;
c. Emphasizing policies that foster individual and public health;
d. Upholding the importance of a well-educated, healthy, and productive healthcare workforce in West Virginia;
e. Providing services and benefits to WVSMA membership;
f. Supporting rigorous standards for medical education and practice in West Virginia;
g. Providing advice and assistance to public officials and policy makers in the design and implementation of programs that affect the health of the citizens of West Virginia; and,
h. Advocating to legislators, public officials, and policy makers, and others for the passage and promulgation of statutes and rules that benefit public health and the practice of medicine in West Virginia.
2. The WVSMA will work with like-minded organizations in West Virginia and nationally including sending the allotted number of delegates to the American Medical Association's House of Delegates in accordance with the manner provided herein.

## Article III: Membership

1. The WVSMA shall consist of members in good standing, who have met and maintain compliance with criteria for membership as set forth in these Constitution and Bylaws, and those persons who are designated as honorary members of the WVSMA by the Board of Trustees (hereinafter "Board").
2. Standards of conduct. Membership in the WVSMA is a privilege subject to a Boardapproved application process. Members of the WVSMA agree to and are bound by:
a. The WVSMA Constitution and Bylaws;
b. WVSMA written policies and procedures;
c. The mandates of West Virginia physician licensure by the West Virginia Board of Medicine or the West Virginia Board of Osteopathic Medicine or their successors; and,
d. Accepted standards of medical ethics as outlined in the Code of Medical Ethics of the American Medical Association and/or the American Osteopathic Association.
e. Failure to follow established WVSMA or professional standards may lead to disciplinary action up to and including revocation of membership.
3. Criteria and classification of membership. Members of the WVSMA must meet the following criteria and shall be classified according to the following classes of membership:
a. Active Members. Active members in the WVSMA shall be limited to physicians in West Virginia who are licensed and in good standing by the West Virginia Board of Medicine or the West Virginia Board of Osteopathic Medicine. Active members shall have the ability to serve as officers, have the right to vote on leadership and policy positions, and serve on committees. Active members will pay the annual dues as determined by the Board.
b. Semi-Retired Members. Semi-retired members shall be those members who work less than 30 hours per week on average. Semi-retired members shall have the ability to serve as officers, have the right to vote on leadership and policy positions, and serve on committees. Semi-retired members shall be assessed one half the annual dues cost of an active member.
c. Retired Members. Retired members shall be those physicians who have retired from the active practice of medicine. Retired members have the right to vote on leadership and policy positions and serve on standing committees but shall not serve as officers of the WVSMA. Retired members shall be assessed one fourth the annual dues cost of an active member.
d. Associate Members. Associate Members shall be i) those physicians not licensed in West Virginia who share and support the purpose of WVSMA or ii) nonphysicians who share and support the purpose of the WVSMA. Associate members do not have the right to vote on leadership or policy positions, but may vote in committees. Associate members shall be assessed one half the annual dues cost of an active member.
e. Corporate Members. Corporate members shall be those organizations that share and support the purpose of WVSMA. Corporate members shall not have any of the rights of membership of the WVSMA. Corporate member annual dues shall be set by the Board.
f. Postgraduate Members. Interns, residents or fellows, who are serving or have completed an internship, residency, or fellowship, or other training program approved by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, and have not started unsupervised practice, shall have the rights and privileges of active members at one fourth the annual dues costs of an active member. The Board may extend this membership class to international medical graduates.
g. Student Members. Student members shall be those persons enrolled in an accredited school of medicine granting a Doctor of Medicine or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine Degree. Student members do not have the right to vote in
elections or on policy positions, but may vote in committees. Student member annual dues shall be set by the Board.
h. Honorary Members. Upon the signed recommendation of one member, seconded by another member, and by a three-fourths vote by ballot (by those who have voting rights) of the votes cast at an annual neeting, honorary life membership may be conferred upon such person(s) deemed to have served the interests of public health, organized medicine, or have rendered notable services to the WVSMA. An honorary member shall have none of the obligations of membership in the WVSMA, but shall be entitled to all privileges except voting and holding office. Honorary members shall be assessed no dues.
4. Dues. The annual dues shall be set by the Board by a majority vote. The WVSMA staff shall notify members three months in advance. With oversight of the treasurer, staff shall notify members who are three months in arrears.
5. Termination of Membership.
a. Any member desiring to resign from the WVSMA shall submit a resignation in writing to the executive director, who shall present the same at the next scheduled meeting of the Board for action.
b. Those whose dues are not paid within three months after receipt of staff notification of overdue membership dues shall be automatically suspended from membership in the WVSMA. Any member suspended for failure to pay annual dues may be automatically reinstated upon payment of past dues owing.
c. Any member who violates standards of professionalism or is known to have engaged in criminal activity may be subject to disciplinary action by the Board, which action may include termination/restriction of membership and/or removal from any office.

## Article IV: Policy Making Process

1. All members of the WVSMA shall be entitled to help determine the policy positions to be adopted by the WVSMA in accordance with this Article.
2. Policy positions of the WVSMA may be introduced by any voting member, on an electronic system accessible to all members. The electronic system shall be the platform for members to debate the issue presented during a defined period as set by the Board. Members with voting privileges will thereafter vote and establish the policy positions of the WVSMA.
3. Process: Policies of the WVSMA shall be adopted pursuant to the following procedures:
a. The Board may initiate an emergency policy upon a determination of the need for the same. Such determination must be supported by a minimum of 10 members. Emergency policy shall go into effect immediately.
b. Any member can initiate a policy discussion. A minimum of 10 members is required for any action on a policy. Such member-initiated policy shall be adopted in the following manner via electronic voting:
i. A quorum of $25 \%$ of the members with voting rights, with a $51 \%$ of favorable votes to pass. This quorum of $25 \%$ must include a minimum of $25 \%$ of active members.
ii. If this quorum of $25 \%$ is not achieved, then a second vote on the same policy will be scheduled in one month with a minimum $10 \%$ quorum requirement, with two-thirds majority of favorable votes required for passage.
iii. If there is no quorum as set forth above, then the policy is deemed to have failed. If the policy fails to pass, it may not be brought up again for consideration for a minimum of one year.
c. The Board shall approve all policies and develop plans to implement them if indicated.
d. Policy reconsideration. The Board may return any member-initiated policy back for reconsideration upon a vote of two-thirds of the Board. A policy referred for reconsideration requires $50 \%$ quorum, and two-thirds majority of favorable votes for passage. Provided, that if such policy fails to pass, it may not be brought up again for consideration for a minimum of one year.

## Article V: Governance

The WVSMA is governed by the Board, which shall have all executive, disciplinary, and supervisory power over the Association. It may fix the hour, place, and medium (in-person, virtual, or hybrid) of any annual, regular, or special meetings, and may perform such other duties as are specified by these Constitution and Bylaws.

1. Board Composition. The Board is composed of 13 elected and four appointed members who are determined as follows:
a. Elected Members: Elected trustees hold the voting power of the Board and consist of four categories: six regional trustees, one postgraduate trustee, one medical student trustee, and six at-large trustees.
i. Election Process: The Executive Director shall accept Trustee nominations from voting members who are in good standing no later than May of the election year.
(1) A minimum of 10 sponsor-members who belong to the nominated categories, or a nomination by the Nominating Committee, are required for each trustee nomination.
(2) Elections are conducted electronically or by mail in June of the election year and are won by a majority ranked-choice voting.
(3) The results of the elections are announced at the conclusion of the voting period and the terms of the Board commence at the next Annual Meeting or no later than the August 31st, whichever is earlier.
ii. Elected Trustees Categories
(1) Regional trustees are elected by active, semi-retired, and retired members who practice or live in their designated region. If a voting member resides in one region and practices in another, the vote is counted in the practice region. A retired member votes in the corresponding residence region. Regions are determined by the

Board in such a way as to reflect the current distribution of practicing physicians and may be updated via a majority vote of the Board once every three terms.
(2) Postgraduate trustee must be a resident member at the time of nomination and throughout the trustee's term. The postgraduate trustee is elected by the resident members.
(3) Medical student trustee must be a student at the time of nomination and throughout the trustee's term. The medical student trustee is elected by the medical student members.
(4) At-Large trustees may be any member in good standing and can be sponsored by any combination of sponsors.
b. Appointed members consist of the following:
i. There shall be one physician trustee appointed by each medical school in West Virginia who has an active group membership agreement who are current voting WVSMA members.
ii. There shall be two non-physician trustees. The voting members of the Board appoint two non-physician trustees. Such trustees are expected to have knowledge and skill outside the field of medicine.
2. Oath of Office. Each trustee, upon assuming the duties set forth herein, shall swear or affirm an oath, in the form prescribed by the Board.
3. Term of Office for Board Members. Each trustee serves for three years and may be permitted to stand for reelection one time. Trustees may be reelected after leaving the board for a full cycle. The Board upon receipt of recommended candidates from the Nominating Committee, shall fill any vacancies that may arise midterm. The unexpired terms filled by midterm appointment are not considered when calculating the reelection limitations in this paragraph.
4. Other Powers of the Board. The Board shall have the power to revoke the membership of those members who have been determined to violate the provisions of Article III, paragraph 5, of these bylaws. The Board shall approve the process and procedure for any such revocation of membership. The Board shall also determine the content of any oath to be administered in accordance with these Constitution and Bylaws. The Board may employ an Executive Director pursuant to the provisions of Article VII herein.
5. Removal from the Board and Administrative Leave. Trustees may be placed on administrative leave or removed from the Board upon a vote of two-thirds of the Board and only for cause.

## Article VI: Officers

1. Officer Elections. The members of the incoming Board elect three current trustees prior to the commencement of the term of the incoming Board as described in Article V. The officers serve for terms of two years.
2. Officer Duties. The officers shall perform the following duties and any other duties as may be adopted by the Board.
a. President. Presides over Board meetings; designates and appoints ad hoc committees; represents WVSMA to the public.
b. Vice President. Chairs Education Committee and Co-Chairs the Public Policy Committee.
c. Treasurer. Chairs Finance Committee and cochairs Membership Committee.
d. Immediate Past President. Fulfills the duties of the President in case of absence, incapacitation, or removal from office of such person until such time as the President returns to service or a successor is duly appointed.
3. Office-holding limitations. No member shall hold more than one office at a time, and no members shall serve more than one term in the same office, except the Treasurer. Officers can serve on and chair committees.
4. Term of office. The term of officers shall commence at the annual meeting or no later than the August 31st, whichever is earlier, at which they are elected and each officer, upon assuming the duties set forth herein, shall swear or affirm an oath in the form as prescribed by the Board.
5. Removal from Office and Administrative Leave. Officers may be placed on administrative leave or removed from office upon a vote of two-thirds of the Board and only for cause.

## Article VII: Executive Director.

1. The Executive Director is employed by the Board and, under its direction, shall be responsible for the general daily administrative and operational affairs of the WVSMA and shall have such duties and responsibilities and compensation as determined by the Board. The terms and conditions of this engagement will be set forth in an appropriate employment agreement signed by the Executive Director and the President of the WVSMA.

## Article VIII: Meetings

1. Board Meetings. The Board shall hold regular quarterly meetings to receive reports of the committees and conduct the business of the WVSMA. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or upon the written or electronic request of three trustees. All meetings shall be open for members to attend in person or virtually. The Board may go into executive sessions for select purposes. A simple majority is required for the Board to conduct business.
2. Annual Meeting. WVSMA shall hold one annual meeting as set by the Board during which elected officers assume their roles and the Board and membership receive reports of the outgoing officers and committees, and for any other business that may arise.
3. Special Meeting. Special meetings may be called by the President, a simple majority of the Board, or called upon by the written request of at least ten percent of the eligible voting members of the WVSMA.

## Article IX: Committees

1. WVSMA committees shall perform the functions described herein and other functions as charged by the Board. Committees shall submit committee reports for review and action at the following Board meeting. No committee shall exercise executive power without prior approval by the Board. All committee members serve at the pleasure of the Board. In case of time-sensitive matters, the Chairperson(s) may request the President to call for an emergency Board meeting for action. All emergency actions shall be reviewed and ratified at the following Board meeting.
2. Trustees and past committee members may participate in committee meetings in a nonvoting capacity upon approval of the chairperson of that committee. Chairpersons may invite non-voting members to join committees. Committee meetings occur as per the directive of the Board, or more frequently at the discretion of their respective chairpersons. A simple majority is required for the committee to conduct business.
3. The President may appoint temporary ad hoc committees and task forces to perform certain specified functions or tasks. Ad hoc committees shall expire at the end of the term of the President who created them, unless extended by the succeeding President.
4. Standing Committees.
a. Executive Committee
i. Composition: Four officers, including the President, plus two trustees ii. Purpose: Making emergency and operational decisions in between board meetings, which decisions are to be ratified at the next board meeting.
b. Nominations and Appointments Committee (Hereinafter referred to as NAC) i. Composition: Past President, who shall serve as Chairperson, and the chairpersons of the Public Policy, Publications, Membership, and Finance Committees and one active member.
ii. Purpose: The NAC shall consider and recommend a slate of four nominees to the Board and AMA Delegates and Alternates, prior to the Annual meeting. NAC shall nominate candidates to fill Board vacancies, subject to Board majority vote. NAC is responsible for developing and implementing a Committee Appointment Program (Hereinafter referred to as CAP) and soliciting and/or vetting candidates with committee privileges according to the requirements of the corresponding committees. NAC may recommend waiving certain requirements to the Board on a
case-by-case basis. The NAC is tasked with the development and maintenance of a diversity and inclusivity policy and advocates for a representative environment in various committees that includes but not limited to diversity of specialty, employment type, gender, race, ethnicity, spirituality, and sexual orientation.
c. Public Policy Committee (Hereinafter referred to as PPC)
i. Composition: The PPC shall consist of no less than five members, cochaired by the Public Policy chairperson and the Vice President. The Public Policy chairperson shall have served on the committee or have had public policy experience previously.
ii. Purpose: The PPC shall receive and consider all proposed resolutions to determine whether such are consistent with the stated purposes of the WVSMA and oversee the performance of the policy-making process in accordance with Article IV. PPC shall review all submitted resolutions in view of current WVSMA Policy Compendium for relevance, suitability, or conflict with prior policies. The PPC shall engage with the originating sponsors to resolve any conflict before initiating policy in accordance with Article IV item 3b The PPC shall also develop and maintain a rule providing for the sunsetting review or reaffirmation process for all WVSMA policies and present its recommendations to the Board which shall then refer the same to the general membership for approval.
d. Finance Committee (Hereinafter referred to as FC)
i. Composition: The FC shall consist of no less than five members of whom one member shall be the Vice President, and it shall be co-chaired by the Treasurer and a trustee member with a business, accounting, finance or related relevant expertise.
ii. Purpose: The FC shall oversee the finances and assets of the Association including properties and investment accounts. It shall prepare a budget for the fiscal year beginning the first day of each January and submit the same to the Board no later than preceding first day of December for the Board's approval. The FC shall oversee the WVSMA internal controls and review financial and investment policies as well as audits. The FC may submit amendments to the budget for the current fiscal year to the Board.
e. Education Committee (Hereinafter referred to as EdC)
i. Composition: The EdC shall consist of no less than five members and is co-chaired by the Vice President and a chairperson appointed by Board.
ii. Purpose: The EdC plans educational events including but not limited to the annual meeting and other in-person or virtual programs. The EdC determines program content, format, and site as well as manages exhibitor relationships in accordance with WVSMA core values and fulfills the guidelines set by WVSMA as related to educational material.
f. Publications Committee (Hereinafter referred to as PubC)
i. Composition: The PubC shall consist of no less than five members and shall be chaired by the Editor of the West Virginia Medical Journal. The Editor is appointed by the Board.
ii. Purpose: The PubC publishes literature including but not limited to WVMJ, WVSMA Newsletter(s), and public announcements. The PubC manages advertising relationships in accordance with WVSMA core values and fulfills the guidelines set by WVSMA.
g. Membership Committee (Hereinafter referred to as MemC)
i. Composition: The MemC shall consist of no fewer than five members and is co-chaired by a chairperson who shall have served on the committee previously, and the Treasurer.
ii. Purpose: MemC monitors membership trends including but not limited to growth, retention, engagement, and benefits. It shall develop programs to gauge and support membership interests and orientations in such a way as to allow the Association to be a good reflection of West Virginia physicians. It may collaborate with The EdC and PubC. They all have the authority to investigate membership violations and recommend disciplinary action.
h. Physician Wellness Committee (Hereinafter referred to as WellC)
i. Composition: The WellC shall consist of a minimum five (5) voting members and shall be co-chaired by the Past President and a Board appointee with experience in health and wellness.
ii. Purpose: The WellC monitors physician wellness of the membership of the WVSMA and monitors trends in West Virginia and nationally. It develops and/or adopts programs to mitigate and/or address acute and chronic challenges to physician wellness at various career stages. It may collaborate with The MemC and PubC.
i. Constitution and Bylaws Committee (Hereinafter referred to as ByLawC)
i. Composition: The ByLawC shall consist of a minimum of five (5) voting members and shall be co-chaired by the Past President and a Board appointee.
ii. Purpose: The ByLawC reviews the Constitution and Bylaws of WVSMA for irregularities, conflicts, or ambiguities and recommends amendments to the same as appropriate.

## Article X: American Medical Association Delegation ( Hereinafter referred to as AMA-D)

1. Composition: AMA-D consists of AMA Delegates and Alternate Delegates as appointed by the Board, in addition to the President. The Board shall appoint one person as chairperson. The term for the delegates is two years and is renewable. Delegates are appointed in alternating cycles. The Board may appoint emergency alternate delegates when needed.
2. Purpose: AMA-D monitors national and AMA related developments and represents WVSMA at the AMA.They report to the Board and issue biannual AMA-D reports.

## Article XI: Parliamentary Authority

1. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the meetings of the WVSMA as applicable, but only to the extent that such are not inconsistent with these Constitution and Bylaws and any special rules of order the WVSMA may adopt.

## Article XII: Amendment of Constitution and Bylaws

1. A minimum of $15 \%$ of the eligible voting members of WVMA or two-thirds of the Board may propose amendments to these Constitution and Bylaws.
2. The Constitution and Bylaws may be amended at any annual meeting of the WVSMA by a two-thirds vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing to the Board no less than 90 days prior to the annual meeting. The proposed amendment shall be publicized to and accessible by the membership on the electronic platform for a minimum of thirty days prior to the annual meeting.
3. Amendments go into effect the following annual meeting or as specified by the Board.
